About Refuse (Trash) Pick-Up

Place trash containers and/or bags at end of driveway late Sunday evening, or early Monday morning, and remove them before nightfall on the same Monday. You are permitted to have four 32-gallon containers. Note: Green waste, construction materials, containers with maggots, too many containers or oversized containers will not be picked up. Stored trash containers must be screened from view.

About Our Treasured Laysan Albatross

The Laysan Albatross has been nesting in Princeville since prior to 1989. They arrive in November and lay their eggs in December. The Albatross is not an endangered or threatened species - BUT they ARE protected under the Migratory Bird Act. On behalf of our treasured Albatross, please do not:

- Disturb or touch the birds, their eggs, or their chicks.
- Feed the birds. Throwing food at them will draw rats and the rats will kill the birds.
- Allow your pets to go near the birds, as they will also destroy the birds, the nests, and the chicks. (Note: Per the Kauai County Law, all pets must be licensed and dogs must be leashed at all times.)
- Allow your children to chase, play, or get close to the Albatross. Well intentioned children can harm the birds and frighten the adults away from their young, causing the demise of the young.
